

ORDINANCE NO. 10

An ordinance to adopt by reference
the Uniform Traffic Code for Michigan
Cities, Townships and Villages

THE TOWNSHIP OF BARODA:

SECTION 1: The Uniform Traffic Code for cities, townships and villages promulgated by the Director of State Police and published in the 1979 edition of the Michigan Administrative Code and amendments as published in the Quarterly Supplement No. 5 to the 1979 edition of the Michigan Administrative Code, in accordance with Public Act 62 of 1956, State of Michigan, is hereby adopted by reference as in this ordinance modified.

SECTION 2: References in the Uniform Traffic Code for Michigan Cities, Townships and Villages to "governmental unit" shall mean the Township of Baroda.

SECTION 3: The Township Clerk shall publish this ordinance in the manner required by law and shall at the same time publish a supplementary notice setting forth the purpose of the said Uniform Traffic Code and of the fact that a complete copy of the Code is available at the office of the Clerk for inspection by the public at all times.

SECTION 4: Ordinance No. 10 adopted 7-16-79, relating to traffic is hereby specifically repealed. All other ordinances inconsistent with the provisions of the Uniform Traffic Code are, to the extent of such inconsistency, hereby repealed.

SECTION 5: The Uniform Traffic Code will be in effect in this governmental unit 30 days after the passage of this adopting ordinance.

BARODA TOWNSHIP

An Ordinance to adopt by reference emergency rules amending the Uniform Traffic Code for Michigan Cities, Townships and Villages.

THE TOWNSHIP OF BARODA ORDAINS:

SECTION 1.

Emergency rules amending sections of the Uniform Traffic Code for cities, townships and villages, and the amendment of such Uniform Traffic Code by the addition of such emergency rules all of which were promulgated by the Director of the Department of State Police, effective July 27, 1979 and published in a supplemental addition to the Michigan Uniform Traffic Code, and amended as a supplement to the edition of the Uniform Traffic Code for cities, townships and villages, in accordance with act number 62 of the Michigan Public Acts of 1956, are hereby adopted by reference amending and adding similarly numbered sections of Ordinances heretofore adopted by the Township of Baroda.

SECTION 2.

The Township Clerk shall publish this Ordinance in the manner required by law and at the same time publish a supplementary notice setting forth the purpose of the Uniform Traffic Code and of the fact that complete copies of the Code as hereby amended are available at the office of the Clerk for inspection by and distribution to the public at all times.

SECTION 3.

This Ordinance will be in effect 30 days after passage and publishing.

**BARODA TOWNSHIP
NOTICE**

To the Residents of the Township of Baroda:

At its regularly scheduled board meeting, held on the 16th day of July, 1979, the Baroda Township Board adopted an Ordinance amending the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships and Villages. The purpose of such amendments is to provide for the safe and orderly regulation of vehicular traffic within the Township. Said amendments were duly promulgated as emergency rules by the Department of State Police and specify whether a person who violates a particular provision of the Uniform Traffic Code is guilty of a misdemeanor or is responsible for a civil infraction, and outlines procedures and penalties relative to same. Copies of the text of the amendments to the Uniform Traffic Code are available from the Township Clerk.
