

ORDINANCE NO. 8

(An ordinance to adopt by reference amendments to the Uniform Traffic Code for Michigan cities, townships and Villages.)

THE TOWNSHIP OF BARODA ORDAINS:

SECTION 1: Amendments to sections of the Uniform Traffic Code for Cities, Townships and Villages, and the amendment of such Uniform Traffic Code by the addition of such sections, all of which were promulgated by the Director of the Department of State Police, effective February 26, 1968, and published in Supplement No. 54 of the 1954 Michigan Administrative Code, in accordance with Act No. 62 of the Michigan Public Acts of 1956, are hereby adopted by reference amending and adding similarly numbered sections of ordinances heretofore adopted by the Township of Baroda.

SECTION 2: The Township Clerk shall publish this ordinance in the manner required by law and shall at the same time publish a supplementary notice setting forth the purpose of the Uniform Traffic Code and of the fact that complete copies of the code as hereby amended are available at the office of the clerk for inspection by and distribution to the public at all times.

SECTION 3: This ordinance will be in effect 20 days after passage, and posting.

NOTICE OF ADOPTION OF AMENDMENTS TO THE UNIFORM TRAFFIC CODE
